Gov't Signs MOU With Japanese Medical Group



MONROVIA: The government of Liberian (GOL) through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and the Japanese Ebola Countermeasure Medical Group (JECM) have signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) to which the parties have committed to work exclusively together to establish a world-class, state-of-the-art Center for Detection of Infectious Diseases, with special emphasis on the Ebola Virus Disease (EVD).

According to a Foreign Ministry release, Foreign Minister Marjon V. Kamara signed on behalf of government while the Executive Director of the JECM Group, Dr. Yasuhiro Yamamoto, signed for his Group.

In brief remarks after the signing, Liberia's Foreign Minister thanked the Japanese Group for the hectic and productive engagements with the GOL, especially the discussions

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS OF THE REPUBLIC OF LIBERIA AND THE JAPANESE EBOLA **COUNTERMEASURE MEDICAL GROUP**

This Working Memorandum is made on this 7^{th} day of April 2016 in Monrovia by and between the Japanese Ebola Countermeasure Group (JECM) and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Liberia.

WHEREAS, the Government of the Republic of Liberia and the Japanese Ebola Countermeasure Group have committed to work exclusively together to establish a world-class, state-of-the-art Center for Detection of Infectious Diseases, with special emphasis on Ebola;

WHEREAS, JECM has committed to provide high standard methods of early detection, care, training and research under the guidance of scientific methods, well established and highly recommended by the Japanese Scientific and Medical technology societies, closely working with the JECM; and


WHEREAS, JECM will provide, exhaustively explain and submit to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs comprehensive documents on medical technology of the highest standards to prevent occurrences and reoccurrences of the deadly breakout of Infectious diseases, including Ebola; and

WHEREAS, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Liberia will, at its earliest convenience, introduce a formal request for the acquisition of a scientific and medical technology package, recommended by the JECM to the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs through the appropriate channels duly established between the two countries.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

That the cooperation between the Japanese Ebola Countermeasure Medical Group and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs will focus on the following specific key elements:

- Development of infrastructure for the National Public Health Institute;
- Provision of medical logistics;
- Establishment of a National Public Health Reference Laboratory;
- Human resource capacity building, focusing on training in the following areas:
 - o Disaster Response and Pandemics Preparedness;
 - o Infectious Disease Specialists:
 - o Emergency Medicine Specialists;
 - o Public Health Specialists in epidemiology, virology, emergency preparedness, research methodology:



- Emergency Medical Services (EM5);
- Emergency Medical Education; and
- Establishing an Exchange Program between Liberian and Japanese specialists to engage in learning, research and training.
